Crystal—Term 3

English	This term in English, the children will be exploring their new book 'Man on the Moon' by Simon Bartram. Based on only the front cover of the story the children will learn the features of a letter and compose one themselves for Bob. Bob's response to their letter will come in the form of his book. We will then create acrostic poems in response to one of the settings the alien encounters and how he might feel there.
Maths	The children will be continuing to develop their number, problem solving and reasoning skills in maths this term. Year 2 will be completing their shape learning with 3D shape and then move onto money, learning to both count and give change. Towards the end of the term we will begin exploring multiplication.
Science	This term in Science, the children will be beginning a new topic: 'Everyday Materials' They will be able to identify, compare and recognise different materials around their environments and discuss how certain materials are more suitable for particular objects.
History	In History this term the children will be focusing their learning on the life of Pocahontas, whilst also exploring two other great explorers Neil Armstrong and Bessie Coleman alongside. We will explore who Pocahontas was, why she was important, colonialism and why we should remember Pocahontas.
Art	In Art the children will be crafting and designing abstract maps. We will begin the topic by going on a walk to the library, recording our journeys on a map. Using this map we will then draw out our own maps of the journey. From this, we will explore various medium to evolve and build upon our drawings. We will also be showcasing our artwork so the children can explore what it feels like to be an artist.
Music	In music we are starting a new topic 'musical me' in which the children will learn to sing and play an instrument at the same time, read musical notation, use letter notation to compose their own music and perform a group composition. We will be particularly focusing on musical vocabulary and terminology.
Computing	The children will develop their Computing skills by learning how to effectively question and search the internet to find accurate results.
RE	In R.E, the children will be exploring the Gospel, focusing on the big question 'What is the good news that Jesus brings'. Our learning will be broken down into sub-questions so that the children can explore different strands of the Gospel stories and why they are important to us.
PE	This term in P.E, the children will be developing a range of gymnastic skills with Miss Bracken. They will be continuing to work on their coordination, teamwork and agility within these sessions. We will also be partaking in swimming lessons at the local swimming pool.
