

Diamond — Term 3

English	This term in English, the children will be exploring their new book, 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. They will be creating letters in role and will be able to identify features of letters confidently. We will discuss the illustrations and how these support the children's learning, as we read the text.
Maths	The children will be continuing to develop their number, problem solving and reasoning skills in maths this term through learning about multiplication and division. This will include looking at written methods for multiplication and division. We will then look at different length measurements and how to calculate perimeter.
Science	This term in Science, the children will be beginning a new topic: 'Sound.' They will identify how sounds are made and recognise how vibrations work. This will then include using different equipment to record sounds and identify
History	In History this term, the children will be learning about The Anglo-Saxons. The children will learn about what life was like with the Anglo-Saxons, who ruled Anglo-Saxon Britain and what we can learn about this from looking at different written sources.
Art/DT	In Art this term, the children will be looking at 'Painting and Mixed Media,' with a focus on light and dark. This will include looking at different colours and understanding how to mix paints effectively to create shades of light and dark. As part of this, the children will produce various artistic styles.
PSHE	The children will be learning about health and well being. This will include looking at dental health and then thinking about different things that make them happy. Part of this will include looking at different emotions that we can experience and what mental health is.
Computing	In this unit, the children will learn that technology can be used to organise, develop, and explore ideas. The children will be able to apply what they have learnt in this unit when identifying key points in a story or account, writing accounts in which details of character and action are used to interest the reader.
RE	In R.E, the children will be exploring the Christianity topic of 'What kind of world did Jesus want?' We will be looking at examples of the Bible and what Christians believe Jesus did for people. From this, the children will begin to formulate their own opinions of what they believe.
PE	This term in P.E, the children will be exploring Gymnastics. They will be continuing to work on their balance, coordination and agility within these sessions. They will be using different techniques to develop the way they move and travel and have the opportunity to further develop these skills.

A shortcut through the forest to Grandma's house produces some eerie moments – and some oddly familiar characters – in a strikingly illustrated tale about facing fears.

One night a boy is woken by a terrible sound. A storm is breaking, lightning flashing across the sky. In the morning Dad is gone and Mum doesn't seem to know when he'll be back. The next day Mum asks her son to take a cake to his sick grandma. "Don't go into the forest," she warns. "Go the long way round."
