MESSAGE FROM MRS STONEHAM

The children learnt about the significance of hot cross buns in our Wednesday morning worship which was led by The HiStory Troupe. They spoke about how it marks the end of the Christian season of Lent, how the cross represents the crucifixion, the spices signify the spices used to embalm Jesus at burial and the orange peel to reflect upon the bitterness of the time. They also reflected on that many years ago, hot cross buns could only be purchased at Easter and we can now buy them at any time of the year.

The children have been able to reflect upon the signs and symbols that help us remember who Jesus was and what Christians believe he did for us.

Next week we will travel through the Easter story together, starting with Palm Sunday, delivering a fresh understanding of Jesus' teaching and how this underpins our own Christian values.
