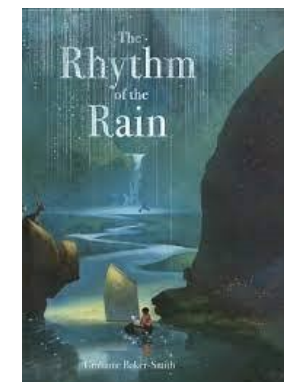

Diamond —Term 5

English	This term in English, the children will be exploring their new book, 'The Rhythm of the Rain' by Grahame Baker-Smith. They will be writing for a range of purposes, understanding the importance of water and the water cycle. Exploring and developing the themes of the book through persuasive letter writing.
Maths	This term we will explore decimals, looking at finding tenths as a decimal. We then move onto making hundredths of a decimal. This will progress onto using money including decimals and use this to solve real life problems. In time we will explore reading and converting times between analogue and digital.
Science	This term in Science, the children will be beginning a new topic: 'Animals including humans' They will learn about the role of teeth and the different organs roles in the digestive system.
Geography	In geography this term, the children will be learning about 'Rivers'. We will look at the major rivers of the world, including exploring erosion, transportation and deposition. Concluding with exploring why we should protect rivers from pollution.
Art	In art, we will explore colours on a mood board. We will explore the artist, William Morris where we will create patterns in their drawings. Developing different ways to make repeated patterns. They will use their sketch books to explore different ways to make patterns and use these on different fabrics.
PSHE	The children will be learning about economic well-being. They will identify and justify items that are good value for money. Look at ways to track spending and how they can keep money safe. As well as exploring financial careers.
Computing	Computing this term will be 'Animation' where they will use 2 animate to create their own animations. This will begin with flip book cartoons developing by using stop motion technology.
RE	In R.E, we will be exploring Hinduism. We will explore what Hindu's do to show their faith, both at home and at the temple. This will include learning about the Hindu traditions as well understanding their sacred text.
PE	This term in P.E, the children will be using the ball skills they have learnt to develop their knowledge of Tennis and rounders. They will develop hand-eye co-ordination as well as working in teams to develop resilience, co-operation and team work.

The ubiquity of water throughout the world, its necessity to humans and animals and how the water cycle works are all explored in an imaginative combination of words and pictures. It begins and ends with Isaac, playing in a pool by a mountainside as raindrops start to fall, and wondering where the water goes from a jar he empties. The reader follows the river that flows past Isaac's home as it winds through the countryside and the city to the sea. Mist from the ocean rises up into a cloud bringing rain to thirsty people in a land far from Isaac's pool.
