They will learn: to empathise with characters, explore possible reasons for their actions and consider decisions they might make; to explore narrative plot, settings, characters and draw inferences to aid understanding; to write texts based on fictional experiences and to write in a chosen form for a selected audience. The children will be continuing to develop their number, problem solving and reasoning skills in Maths this term. In particular we will be: learning about negative numbers; finding fractions of amounts: solving problems with coordinates; multiplying with fractions; and drawing, reading and interpreting line graphs and charts. This term the children will begin a new topic about living things. We will look at the life cycle and the life process of reproduction of mammals, amphibians, insects, birds and plants. In History this term, the children will be starting a new topic: Civil Rights. We will look at what the United States of America was like in the 1950s and the changes that have taken place to make life fairer for all citizens. Children will learn about key influential activists such as Rosa Parks and Dr. Martin Luther King Jnr. This term the children will be learning about installation art, including identifying and comparing art installations, exploring space and scale in 3D art, problem-solving in construction, planning installations to communicate ideas, and applying knowledge to develop and present installation art pieces effectively. The children will be learning how to count, say the days of the week and the months of the year in French. So that they can say the date.
