Ruby—Term 1

English	This term in English, we are writing a diary entry from the perspective of Ug, the main character in our book and then move onto instruction writing. In Destination Reader we will be learning the seven reading skills, focusing on a new skill each week, while reading and exploring our core text.
Maths	In maths this term we are consolidating our understanding of place value and exploring place value of numbers to 1,000. We will then be focusing on addition and subtraction, a core mathematical skill. We will be practicing using column addition and subtraction of both 2 and 3– digit numbers.
Science	This term in Science, the pupils will be exploring the topic rocks. We will be comparing and grouping different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and physical properties, describing how fossils are formed and recognising soils are made from rocks and organic matter.
History	In History this term we are looking at prehistoric Britain. We will be investigating what life was like during the Ice Age and Stone Age, considering what tools they used and why Bronze was used for tools and weapons and exploring what sites such as Stonehenge can tell us about life in the past.
Art	In art this term alongside our history topic on prehistoric Britain we will be focusing on prehistoric painting. Across the term we will recognise the processes involved in prehistoric painting, consider the differences between prehistoric and modern day painting and develop an understanding of colour mixing with natural pigments.
Music	In music this term we will be exploring body and tuned percussion. We will be identifying the structure of a piece of music, practicing playing a sequence in the correct order and time, writing a simple piece of music and in a small group performing the piece of music.
PSHE	This term we will be looking at families and relationships. We will be recognising that all families are different and considering how families offer support. We will discuss what good listening looks like, what a friendship is and consider who we can trust and why.
RE	In R.E, the pupils will be exploring the question 'What is it like to follow God?' We will be making links between the story of Noah and the idea of covenant and considering when people make promises in life as well as in the Bible.
PE	This term in P.E, the pupils will be exploring Tag Rugby with Miss Bracken, learning the skills of Tag Rugby.
