Crystal—Term 3

English	This term in English, the pupils will be exploring their new book 'Man on the Moon' by Simon Bartram. Based on only the front cover of the story the pupils will learn the features of a letter and compose one themselves for Bob. Bob's response to their letter will come in the form of his book. The pupils will then write a newspaper article detailing Bob's job on the moon.
Maths	The pupils will be continuing to develop their number, problem solving and reasoning skills in maths this term. Year 2 will be learning about 2D and 3D shape and then move onto money, learning to both count and give change. Towards the end of the term we will begin exploring multiplication.
Science	This term in Science, the pupils will be beginning a new topic: 'Everyday Materials' They will be able to identify, compare and recognise different materials around their environments and discuss how certain materials are more suitable for particular objects.
History	In History this term the pupils will be learning about adventurers and explores. We will be looking at significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. The pupils will be focusing on Neil Armstrong and looking at his achievements.
Art	In Art the pupils will be crafting and designing maps through various art forms. In this sequence of lessons the pupils will develop skills in sorting, designing and evaluating art. We will explore various medium to evolve and build upon our drawings. We will also be showcasing our artwork so they can explore what it feels like to be an artist.
Music	In music this term the pupils will be developing their skills in dynamics, timbre, tempo and motifs. Our key theme will be space, which ties in with our class book and wider curriculum learning. The pupils will compare two pieces of music using some musical vocabulary to describe the changes in tempo, dynamics and timbre. Successfully create and play a motif.
RE	In R.E, the pupils will be exploring the Gospel, focusing on the big question 'What is the good news that Jesus brings'. Our learning will be broken down into sub-questions so that the pupils can explore different strands of the Gospel stories and why they are important to us.
PE	This term in P.E, the pupils will be developing a range of gymnastic skills with Miss Bracken. They will be continuing to work on their coordination, teamwork and agility within these sessions.
